#### Welcome to Digital Design I & II

Students in Digital Design will develop skills that lay the foundation for producing web-ready business communications. During the first semester, students focus on broadcasting and video production followed by developing graphic skills with Adobe Illustrator and Photoshop software. They also will learn to create

web pages from scratch using HTML 5 and CSS, then by using Dreamweaver software. Second semester, students will advance their skills to create and publish their websites, and learn about professional design principles.

Students will finally create an online portfolio to showcase the skills they have developed.
